6.	Description of content: This regulation specified the maximum level requirement of the flour treatment agent which can be used as a food additive in processed food. The names of the flour treatment agent which are allowed consist of: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. L-Ammonium lactate (INS.328);2. Sodium stearoyl-2-lactylate (INS.481 (i));3. Ammonium chloride (INS.510);4. Calcium sulphate (INS.516);5. Calcium oxide (INS.529);6. alpha-Amylase from <i>Bacillus licheniformis</i> (carbohydrase) (INS.1100);7. alpha-Amylase from <i>Aspergillus oryzae</i>, var. (INS.1100);8. alpha-Amylase from <i>Bacillus stearothermophilus</i> (INS.1100);9. alpha-Amylase from <i>Bacillus stearothermophilus</i> expressed in <i>Bacillus subtilis</i> (INS.1100);10. alpha-Amylase from <i>Bacillus subtilis</i> (INS.1100);11. alpha-Amylase from <i>Bacillus megaterium</i> expressed in <i>Bacillus subtilis</i> (INS.1100);12. Protease from <i>Aspergillus oryzae</i>, var. (INS.1101 (i));13. Papain (INS.1101 (ii)); and14. Bromelain (INS.1101 (iii)). <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The maximum level requirement of the flour treatment agent in each food category is mentioned in Annex 1 as an integral part of this regulation.• The flour treatment agent in processed food must be proven by a certificate of analysis.• The type and use of a flour treatment agent other than that listed in Annex 1 should only be used after obtaining approval from the Head of NADFC.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The flour treatment agent and processed food containing flour treatment agent which has marketing approval must be adjusted to be in line with this regulation no later than one year from the date of enactment. • The flour treatment agent and processed food containing flour treatment agent which is submitted before the prevailing of this regulation will be processed based on the Regulation of Minister of Health No. 722/Menkes/Per/IX/1988 on Food Additive as amended by the Regulation of Minister of Health No. 1168/Menkes/Per/X/1999. The validity period of this marketing approval will be one year.
