<p>6. Description of content: The main changes on the revised regulation are as follow:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Fresh Food of Plant Origin shall only be imported to Indonesia from:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. countries have a recognition for its food safety control system; orb. countries with registered food safety testing laboratory/ies.2. Procedure for recognition of food safety system control in exporting country (article 1 point a) as in the previous regulation with minor changer.3. The requirement for registration of food safety testing laboratory/ies in exporting country (article 1 point b) are:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. The laboratory/ies shall accredited by an authorized and competent body in exporting country; andb. The laboratory/ies shall has the competency to analyze the type of FFPO that will be exported to Indonesia with testing scope at least in accordance with the type of pesticide used in exporting country and other relevant testing parameters required in this regulation.4. Procedure for registration of food safety testing laboratory/ies in exporting country are as follows:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. application for registration by Food Safety Competent Authority in exporting country accompanied by required documents/information;b. document assessment;c. field verification; andd. registered food safety laboratory/ies stipulated by Minister of Agriculture.5. Related to document requirements, there are some changes as follows:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Prior notice shall be issued by exporter of Fresh Food of Plant Origin (FFPO) in origin country electronically through IAQA's official web portal (http://eplagsystem.karantina.pertanian.go.id/notice/);

Aside from prior notice, FFPO's importation from country with registered food safety testing laboratory/ies shall be completed with Certificate of Analysis (CoA) issued by registered laboratory.</p> <p>6. This regulation also stipulates special provision for transit country.</p> <p>7. The recognitions decree that have been stipulated for several countries will remain valid until the end of the stipulation period.</p>
