

Import Regulations and Phytosanitary Requirements for the Importation of Dried Apricot from Turkey into the Republic of Indonesia

Regulation bases:

1. Indonesian Law No. 16 of 1992 concerning Animal, Fish, and Plant Quarantine.
2. Government Regulation No. 14 of 2002 concerning Plant Quarantine.
3. Minister of Agriculture Decree No. 51/Permentan/KR.010/9/2015 concerning List of Indonesian Quarantine Pest.
4. Minister of Agriculture Decree No. 55/PERMENTAN/KR.040/11/2016 concerning Food Safety Control on Importation and Exportation of Fresh Food of Plant Origin.
5. Other related Minister of Agriculture Decree.

Importation of dried apricot from Turkey into the territory of Republic of Indonesia shall be as follows:

1. The consignment must be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate from National Plant Protection Organization of Turkey.
2. Dried fruits must be produced from production area and processed in packing house registered by government authority in Turkey.
3. The consignment must be free from *Carpoglyphus lactis* (dried fruit mite).
4. The consignment well packed by vacuum pack and secured against infestation or contamination of pest. Packaging must be undamaged and should use a clean container.
5. The consignment must be free from any contamination of plant debris, soil, and other inert matter.
6. The consignment must fulfill other requirements on Indonesian food safety regulation as mentioned in the Minister of Agriculture Decree No. 55/Permentan/KR.040/11/2016
7. The consignment must be through the designated point of entry as mentioned in the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture No. 44/ Permentan/OT.140/3/2014.
8. The consignment must be notified and submitted to the Plant Quarantine Inspector at the point of entry in Indonesia for the purposes of plant quarantine measures.
9. If consignments are infested by Indonesian quarantine pest then consignment will be treated, refused or destroyed.
