

## **Import Regulations and Phytosanitary Requirements for the Importation of Fresh Fig from Turkey into the Republic of Indonesia**

### **Regulation bases:**

1. Indonesian Law No. 16 of 1992 concerning Animal, Fish, and Plant Quarantine.
2. Government Regulation No. 14 of 2002 concerning Plant Quarantine.
3. Minister of Agriculture Decree No. 42/PERMENTAN/OT.140/6/2012 concerning Quarantine Measures for the Entry of Fresh Fruits and Fresh Fruit Vegetables into Territory of Republic Indonesia.
4. Minister of Agriculture Decree No. 51/Permentan/KR.010/9/2015 concerning List of Indonesian Quarantine Pest.
5. Minister of Agriculture Decree No. 55/PERMENTAN/KR.040/11/2016 concerning Food Safety Control on Importation and Exportation of Fresh Food of Plant Origin.
6. Other related Minister of Agriculture Decree.

### **Importation of fresh fig from Turkey into the territory of Republic of Indonesia shall be as follows:**

1. The consignment must be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate from National Plant Protection Organization of Turkey.
2. The fruits must be produced from orchard and processed in packing house registered by government authority in Turkey.
3. The consignment must free from quarantine pests as attached.
4. The consignment must be treated with cold treatment 2°C for 16 days or 3°C for 20 days. Treatment should be conducted in the country of origin. Information of treatment must be stated in the treatment column of Phytosanitary Certificate.
5. The consignment well packed and secured against infestation or contamination of pest. Packaging must be undamaged and should use a clean container.
6. The consignment must free from any contamination of plant debris, soil, and other inert matter.
7. The consignment must fulfill other requirements on Indonesian food safety regulation as mentioned in the Minister of Agriculture Decree No. 55/Permentan/KR.040/11/2016
8. The consignment must be through the designated point of entry as mentioned in the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture No. 42/Permentan/OT.140/6/2012.
9. The consignment must be notified and submitted to the Plant Quarantine Inspector at the point of entry in Indonesia for the purposes of plant quarantine measures.
10. If consignments are infested by Indonesian quarantine pest then consignment will be treated, refused or destroyed.
11. If Information of treatment is not stated in the treatment column of Phytosanitary Certificate, then consignment ill be refused.
