Description of content: This regulation is stipulated in order to ensure the safety of fishery products imported into the territory of the Republic of Indonesia to be safe for human consumption and not endanger the sustainability of fish resources and the environment. The scope of regulations as follows: 1. Requirements and procedures for importation of fish products; a. Importer shall import fishery products from a registered exporter in the country of origin; b. Importation of fishery products conducted by representatives countries shall be used for internal consumption, exhibition and/or promotions Inspection of fish products; c. Any fishery products imported into the territory of the Republic of Indonesia must be accompanied by: – Health Certificate for Fish and Fishery Products issued by competent authority in the country of origin; – Certificate of Origin (CoO) issued by competent authority in the country of origin; – Label or documents (invoice/packing list) written or printed in Bahasa Indonesia and English; – Catch Certificate as stipulated in European Council Regulation (EC) No. 1005/2008 (for the purpose of re-export to European Union) d. Importers or representatives of friendly countries that will import the fishery products to the territory of the Republic of Indonesia shall obtain Fisheries Products Import Permit from the Director General of Fisheries Product Processing and Marketing, Ministry of Marine Affairs and Fisheries; 2. Any fishery products imported into the territory of the Republic of Indonesia subject to document verification and physical inspection by Fish Quarantine officers;
