6. Description of content: This regulation has been issued as the legal basis for the implementation of organic farming systems. The implementation of the organic farming systems based on the ISO of Organic Food Systems. This regulation aims to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• set the Indonesian organic control;• provide assurance and protection to the people from the organic products that do not meet the requirements;• provide business certainty for producers of organic products;• establish organic farming production systems which are credible and traceable;• maintain the ecosystem role in protecting the environment;• increase the added value and competitiveness of agricultural products. The scope of the regulation is as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Cultivation of organic agriculture (for plant origin and animal origin);b. Means of production (manufacture of fertilizers and pesticides);c. Certification: Each establishment unit which has implemented Organic Farming Systems may submit certification to Organic Certification Bodies which are accredited by the National Accreditation Committee (KAN);d. Labeling:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• all organic products that have been certified and distributed in Indonesia, both for domestic and imported products, must have the Indonesian organic logo attached.• re-packaged organic products must not have the Indonesian organic logo attached prior to recertification.

Imported organic products: Organic products imported into the territory of Indonesia shall be accompanied with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transaction Certificate published by Organic Certification Bodies which certify the establishment unit in the country of origin; • Health Certificate or Certificate of Free Sale published by the authorized institution in the country of origin. <p>f. Education and controlling;</p> <p>g. Sanctions.</p>
