6.	<b>Description of content:</b> This regulation specified the maximum level requirement of humectant which can be used as a food additive in processed food. The names of humectant which are allowed consist of: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Sodium Lactate (INS.325);</li><li>2. Potassium Lactate (INS.326);</li><li>3. Sodium Hydrogen Malate (INS.350 (i));</li><li>4. Sodium Malate (INS.350 (ii));</li><li>5. Glycerols (INS.422);</li><li>6. Polydextroses (INS.1200); and</li><li>7. Triacetin (INS.1518).</li></ol> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The maximum level requirement of humectant in each food category is mentioned in Annex 1 as an integral part of this regulation.</li><li>• The humectant in processed food must be proven by a certificate of analysis.</li><li>• The type and use of humectant other than that listed in Annex 1 should only be used after obtaining approval from the Head of NADFC.</li><li>• The humectant and processed food containing humectant which has marketing approval must be adjusted to be in line with this regulation no later than one year from the date of enactment.</li><li>• The humectants and processed food containing humectant which are submitted before the prevailing of this regulation will be processed based on the Regulation of Minister of Health No. 722/ Menkes/Per/IX/1988 on Food Additive as amended by the Regulation of Minister of Health No. 1168/Menkes/Per/X/1999. The validity period of this marketing approval will be one year.</li></ul>
